



Academic Advising Notes and Legend

Part-time students may also follow this sequence. Developmental coursework may be required.

- 1 You may use this pathway if you entered one of the seven colleges on or before this date.
- 2 Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours (15 hours) required for graduation through instruction by one of the seven colleges of the DCCCD awarding the degree.
- ^ Must earn a grade of "C" or higher in all ACCT and ACNT courses. A C or better is also required
- for ENGL 1301 B.A.A.S. foundation courses BAAS 3020, BAAS 3000 and BAAS 4980. # ACNT 1303 Introduction to Accounting I and ACNT 1304 Introduction to Accounting II are
- recommended prior to enrollment in ACCT 2301 for a student with no accounting background.
- C This course counts for the Core Curriculum at any public college or university in Texas.
- *There are several options to fulfill this requirement. See your academic advisor for a specific list.
- Must take any three (3) hour college-level course to satisfy this elective requirement.

() Course numbers shown in parentheses are equivalent courses students can still take at any DCCCD campus (or other Texas public college or University). In order to complete the B.A.A.S. degree a student must earn a C or better in the following core courses: ENGL 1301 Composition I and ENGL 1320 Composition II (ENGL 1302). A C or better is also required for the three B.A.A.S. foundation courses BAAS 3020, BAAS 3000 and BAAS 4980.

UNT Professional Development Concentration Options

This Pathway includes a 12-hour concentrations in Finance (FINA^^) and Economics (ECON**). The economics concentration utilizes the ECON 2301 and 2302 from DCCCD.
