^{##} In order to complete the B.A.A.S. degree a student must earn a "C" or better in the following core courses: ENGL 1301 Composition I and TECM 2700 Technical Writing. A "C" or better is also required for the three B.A.A.S. foundation courses: BAAS 3020, BAAS 3000 and BAAS 4980.

UNT Professional Development Concentration Options

This example Pathway includes a 12-hour concentrations in Finance (^{AA}) and Economics (^{**}). The economics concentration utilizes the ECON 2301 and 2302 from DCCCD. Other concentration options are available. Business Management and Marketing are just two of many concentration and focus areas available with the UNT B.A.A.S Degree. UNT Residency and Advanced Hours:

Up to 90 of the 120 hours required for the BAAS degree may be transferred from other approved institutions. At least 30 hours must be taken from UNT. The degree also requires that 36 of the 120 hours are advanced level (from courses with a 3000 or 4000 prefix) and that at least 24 of these are taken from UNT.
