courses: ENGL 1301 Composition I and ENGL 1320 Composition II (ENGL 1302). A C or better is

also required for the three B.A.A.S. foundation courses BAAS 3020. BAAS 3000 and BAAS 4980.

7 This example pathway includes a formal 24-hour focus area in Homeland Security that combines courses from Criminal Justice (CJUS) and Emergency Administration and Disaster Planning (EADP). Other 24- hour focus areas and 12-hour professional development concentrations are also available. Cyber-Crime (CJUS) and Business Management (MGMT) are just two examples of othe concentrations and focus areas available with the UNT B.A.A.S Degree.
