¹ You may use this pathway if you entered one of the seven colleges on or before this date.

² Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours (15 hours) required for graduation through instruction by one of the seven colleges of the DCCCD awarding the degree.

³ This course counts for the Core Curriculum at any public college or university in Texas. + Criminal Justice Electives must be selected from the following: CRIJ 1313, CRIJ 2313, CRIJ 2301, CJSA 1392, CJSA 1393

++ Required Support Courses must be chosen from the following: CJSA 1382, CJSA 2382, CRIJ 2314, CRIJ 2323, CRIJ 2328

^ If you complete CRIJ 2313 as one of the Criminal Justice Electives in Semester 3 and CRIJ 2328 as one of the Required Support Courses in Semester 4, you will be eligible to apply for the Basic Criminal Justice (BC1) Certificate.

CJSA and CJLE will transfer to the **University of North Texas** if a student is seeking the B.A.A.S. degree.

() Course numbers shown in parentheses next to **UNT** courses can be completed and transferred to **UNT** from any public college or university in Texas.

In order to complete the B.A.A.S. degree a student must earn a C or better in the following core courses: ENGL 1301 Composition I and ENGL 1320 Composition II (ENGL 1302). A C or better is also required for the three B.A.A.S. foundation courses BAAS 3020, BAAS 3000 and BAAS 4980.

⁷ This **example** pathway includes a formal 24-hour focus area in Homeland Security that combines courses from Criminal Justice (CJUS) and Emergency Administration and Disaster Planning (EADP). Other 24- hour focus areas and 12-hour professional development concentrations are also available. Cyber-Crime (CJUS) and Business Management (MGMT) are just two examples of other concentrations and focus areas available with the UNT B.A.A.S Degree.
