<sup>C</sup> This course counts for the Core Curriculum at any public college or university in Texas.

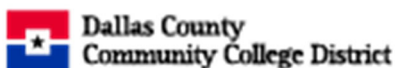

MATH 1332 & 1342 do not fulfill Texas Wesleyan's core and you will be required to take a different math if you do not earn Texas Core Complete. ECON 2301 required for major. ENGL 2326 OR ENGL 2331 required as prerequisite for upper level coursework.

+ Elective courses should be selected according to the intended university to which you will transfer. See your academic advisor for assistance with course selection. Texas Wesleyan Recommends HIST 2321 & 2322 as they apply to the major.

You must earn a grade of "C" or better in English 1301 and the selected college-level mathematics course and receive a GPA of at least 2.00 on all college-level course work.
