- Many of the advanced courses required to complete the Bachelor of Science in Interdisciplinary Studies through UNT require admission to the Teacher Education (TEd) Program. Specifically, admittance to the TEd Program is necessary to take certain courses listed on the Guided Pathway beginning Third Year, Spring Semester.

For admission to the TEd Program, a student must meet the following requirements:

- 60 or more earned credit hours.
- 2.75 or higher GPA in all courses.
- 2.75 or higher GPA in completed core.
- TSI Complete.
- An approved interview questionnaire (instructions are available at <https://www.coe.unt.edu/tedinterview>).
- Active enrollment at UNT with an official degree audit.
- After meeting the above six components, submit an application for Admission to the TEd Program (<https://www.coe.unt.edu/student-advising-office/undergraduate-advising/admission-teacher-education>).
- After acceptance of your application a formal offer of admission is sent to you by email. Submit acceptance of the formal offer within 72 hours of receipt.

¹ Degree plans may change in later catalogs. You may use this pathway if you entered one of the seven colleges on or before this date.

² Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours (15 hours) required for graduation through instruction by one of the seven DCCC colleges awarding the degree.

* There are several options to fulfill this requirement. See your academic advisor for a specific list.

^C This course counts for the Core Curriculum at any public college or university in Texas.

You must earn a grade of "C" or better in English 1301 and the selected college-level mathematics course and receive a GPA of at least 2.50 on all college-level course work.
