TTU Degree Requirements

1. Hours

Students seeking the 120-hour Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (B.A.A.S.) in Applied Leadership degree must first obtain an associate degree from an approved institution. Students will complete a minimum of 60 semester credit hours at Texas Tech University beyond the AAS degree. A minimum of 40 of the 120 hours for the degree must be at the junior/senior level and fulfill degree requirements for the BAAS in Applied Leadership degree as specified in the "General Requirements" in the Undergraduate Academics section of this catalog.

2. Major

a. Occupational Specialization, 36 Hours.

The Occupational specialization is comprised of courses related to a specific occupation, field, or subject. This requirement typically consists of field-specific coursework completed for an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree at a community college. Active-duty military or veterans may receive credit for technical or other formal training courses under this component of the degree plan. Other students who have not completed an occupational specialization through courses taken in a community college or in the military may create one by selecting a primary area of study.

b. Professional Development Concentrations, 36 Hours.

Student will choose two separate, multidisciplinary concentrations of 18 semester credit hours each for a total of 36 hours to enhance the skills acquired by the associate's degree or that compliment themes of interest in the degree.

Concentration I: 18 semester hours of coursework from one of the concentration areas offered through the B.A.A.S. (areas of concentration include human resource development, agricultural leadership, or studies in personal finance) and approved by a B.A.A.S. advisor. Refer to <u>Undergraduate Fields of Study</u> in the TTU Catalog and a B.A.A.S. advisor for other approved areas.

Concentration II: 18 semester hours approved by a B.A.A.S. advisor

c. Writing Intensive – 6 hours

Students must complete 6 hours of writing intensive coursework within the major discipline(s). INTS 4350 will satisfy 3 hours of this requirement. Students will need to select one additional 3-hour writing intensive course within the major.

3. Core Curriculum

Students must complete the State of Texas core curriculum which consists of a total of 42 semester credit hours. Core curriculum courses taken at the sending institution and marked as core on the sending institution's official transcript will transfer to TTU and be applied to BAAS as core curriculum. Students will select additional approved Texas Tech courses deemed by a B.A.A.S. advisor as appropriate to the degree.

5. Uniform Graduation Requirements

- a. Foreign Language Requirement credit for two years of the same language earned in high school or two semesters (or its equivalent) of a single foreign language at the first-year college level. Students need to submit an official high school transcript when applying to the university documenting language credits earned in high school to determine whether additional language is needed.
- b. Laboratory Science Requirement two semester credit hours of science laboratory courses. Labs should correspond with the lectures completed.
- c. Multicultural Requirement In addition to the State of Texas core curriculum, every student must complete at least one 3-hour multicultural course or its equivalent that focuses explicitly on the distinctive subcultures of the United States or on the culture of another society. The following are Texas Common Course Number courses that will apply toward both a core requirement and the TTU multicultural requirement: ARTS 1301; ANTH 2346 or 2351; HUMA 2323; GEOG 1302 or 1303; PHIL 1304; or SOCI 1301. Other course selections are available at TTU for fulfilling this requirement.





6. Additional Notes

- b. The maximum number of transferable semester credit hours from a two-year institution applicable to the degree is 80.
- c. The following credit may be submitted for consideration:
 - i. Credits may be awarded for military training Community College of Air Force (CCAF) or American Council on Education (ACE)
 - ii. Academic credits from regionally accredited institutions of higher education may be transferred into the program. See www.admissions.ttu.edu/index.php/admission-financial_aid/transfer-2/.
